

# The Sophie Cameron Trust

Dear Friends

As I am sure you will have heard, Sophie died unexpectedly on May 30<sup>th</sup> from a virulent chest infection. She was at home with her father at the time of her death and suffered no pain. We are all grieving but send our heartfelt condolences to her family. After a summer when our thoughts have been very much with Sophie's family, the trustees met to consider the future. The strong feeling was that the trust must continue in Sophie's name, and build on the firm financial foundations thanks to your help that we have established, to support research into Encephalitis Lethargica, increase awareness of this devastating disease and help its victims.

On the research front, we are pleased that the national surveillance programme for EL is moving forward. SCT will be cooperating with the department of health which plans a programme to monitor all types of encephalitis in the UK. We will support the salary of the research worker, and hope to identify cases nationally through neurologists in NHS hospitals. Also, those already known to have had the disease are being contacted by letter. Dr Gavin Giovannoni, our scientific adviser, has recently been appointed Professor of Neurology at Barts and the London Hospitals, and will be developing a research team there, who we hope will continue the work on the causes of EL which we previously sponsored at Queens Square, London. We will be meeting with Gavin during the autumn, but meanwhile congratulations to him on his prestigious appointment.

There is growing international interest in Encephalitis Lethargica we are pleased to have supported Professor Joel Vilensky with his publication in the USA of "Diagnosing EL" in Practical Neurology, and further work to be undertaken on Russian literature on the disease.

Closer to home, The Royce clinic is continuing to work with Kelly Brooks, who has made great strides in her mobility and independence under Alison's capable tutelage. She can now get onto her buggy and travel to school or town. Alison and Royce have also laboured long and hard on the research paper emanating from their work with Sophie, which is almost complete. The clinic is also housing equipment used for this project, until a new user can be found.

With the evenings drawing shorter, I hope you will find time to participate in one of the planned fundraising events for this autumn. We are delighted to enclose the menus for the renowned **Pot Luck Dinners** during the period **27<sup>th</sup> October – 9<sup>th</sup> November**. This is a wonderful way to enjoy excellent food with friends or meet new people. Our other event is a **Rock'n'Roll** evening with live band '**Revival**' on **Friday 1<sup>st</sup> December** at **Oldland Village Club, Bristol**.
